

Clinical Pharmacology Reexamination

Department of Pharmacology and Clinical Pharmacology

In order to ensure the proper conduct of the re-examination in the discipline of Clinical Pharmacology, it is necessary to satisfy the following conditions:

1. The reexamination for Clinical Pharmacology will take place on **October 12, 2021 from 15:30 o'clock.**
2. Students who have absences and/or negative grades in the Clinical Pharmacology module (in SIMU must be: statut - atestat) will NOT be admitted to the exam;
3. International students have to be admitted also by the dean's office, if **there are no financial arrears.**
4. The reexamination for Clinical Pharmacology will take place on the Google Meet platform. The reexamination will have 2 stages:
 - Stage I – test in Google Forms
 - Stage II – oral part
5. First stage it will be test in Google Forms, and after that at the same link – will be the oral exam.
6. For **stage I, test in Google Foms** – the students should access the following link, **on 12 October, at 15:30:** <https://meet.google.com/efe-tzdg-sfd>. After 15:45 the access will not be allowed.
7. **The test will start at 15:45.**
8. **Stage II - Oral exam, the students should access on October 12, 2021, at 17:25 the same link:** <https://meet.google.com/efe-tzdg-sfd>
9. It is mandatory for students to have the camera and microphone turned on in order to be monitored / supervised by doctors.
10. Any student who will not have the camera and microphone on / functional will be excluded from the platform, without notice, with the subsequent establishment of the negative grade.
11. Any attempted fraud of the exam will lead to the establishment of a negative grade.
12. Each student assumes the responsibility to satisfy the technical requirements in order to participate at the re-examination. International students until the re-examination have to check and at the dean's office if **admitted, if there are no financial arrears. (this re-examination is possible to be for a fee, make sure**

you pay to be admitted to the re-examination) Otherwise the reexamination will not be valid even if it is positive.
